The County Council acted promptly to clear the river and our thanks go out to the contractors who cleared the bridge the next day. We are now working with them with a view to reconstructing a new bridge that will



reconnect both ends of Bryn Hir; incorporate in some fashion the iconic piece of Slate that served us so well for centuries; and reduce the likelihood of constriction leading to flooding in the area.
