4. THE 'QUEEN BEES' FOOTBALL CLUB

Seating and a changing facility have been mentioned in the past but the field is probably not suitable.

Councillors discussed the need to take the nets down after every game to alleviate vandalism and wildlife getting stuck in the nets.

Cllr Geraint proposed supporting the team with a contribution, Cllr Ceri seconded the proposal. Cllr John Emlyn proposed £200 pounds, all Councillors agreed.
